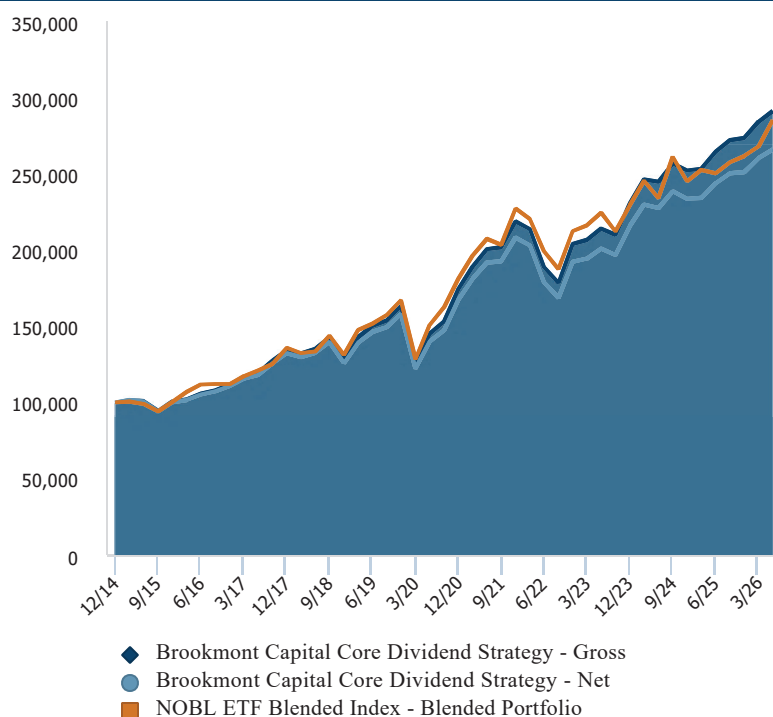
Portfolio Strategy

THE BROOKMONT CORE DIVIDEND STRATEGY is a value strategy of 30-50 individual common stocks that seeks a competitive total return by investing in equity securities that provide a balance between current income and income growth with the potential for long-term capital gains, lower volatility, and downside risks.

Investment Process

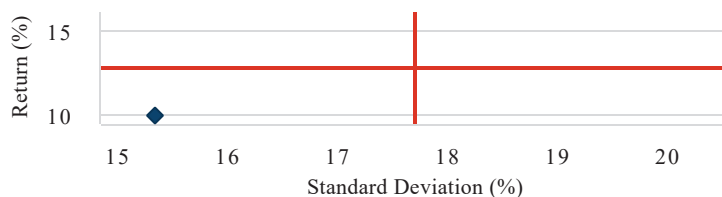
The firm utilizes its bottom up process facilitated by quantitative screens of fundamental characteristics to narrow the selection universe. Once the selection universe is created, the team utilizes bottom up fundamental analysis to find companies with superior operational cash flow and free cash flow growth metrics relative to their peers.

Portfolio Structure

- Typically between 30-50 holdings
- Weightings range from 1.25% to 3.75% at the time of addition
- Strategy typically invests in all 11 sectors of the market as defined by GICS
- Strategy may invest in ADRs
- Low internal correlation between holdings
- Low turnover; typically 5%-20%
- +/- 5% of sector benchmark weighting

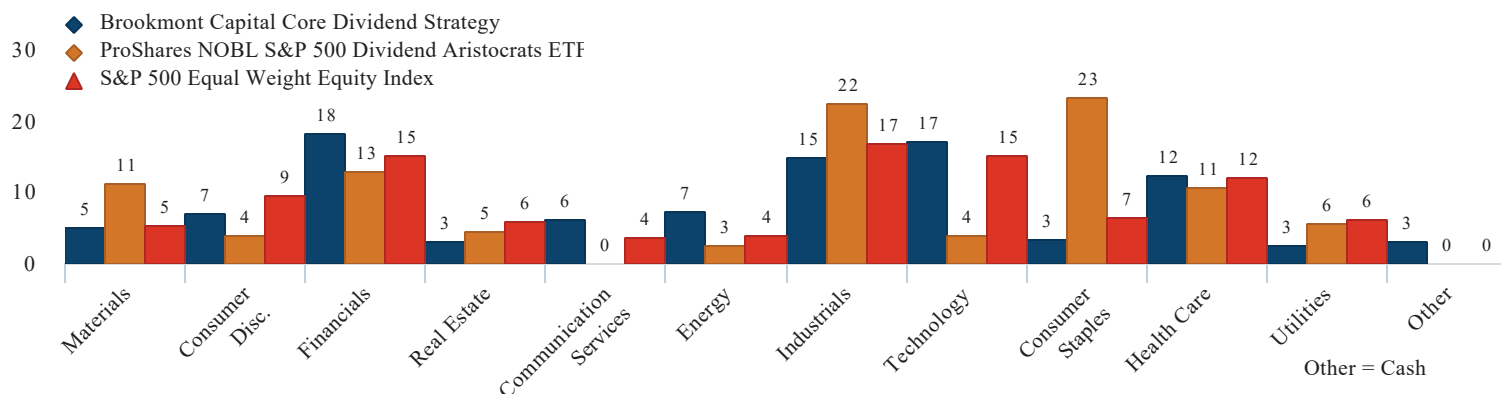

The Brookmont Core Dividend Strategy returns are based on an asset-weighted composite of discretionary accounts that include 100% of the recommended holdings. Individual accounts will have varying returns, including those invested in the Strategy. The reasons for this include 1) the period of time in which the accounts are active, 2) the timing of contributions and withdrawals, 3) the account size, and 4) holding other securities that are not included in the Strategy. Dividends and capital gains are not reinvested. The Strategy does not utilize leverage or derivatives. Returns are based in U.S. dollars. The inception of the Strategy is January 1, 2015.

The Brookmont Core Dividend Strategy Composite contains fully discretionary accounts with similar value equity investment strategies and objectives. For comparison purposes, the Core Dividend Strategy Composite is measured against the ProShares S&P 500 Dividend Aristocrats ETF. The benchmark was changed on June 1, 2026, for all periods. The ProShares S&P 500 Dividend Aristocrats ETF is an exchange-traded fund designed to track the S&P 500 Dividend Aristocrats Index. The fund focuses on U.S. large-cap companies in the S&P 500 that have increased their dividends for at least 25 consecutive years, giving investors exposure to businesses with long records of dividend growth, financial durability, and shareholder returns.

ProShares S&P 500 Dividend Aristocrats ETF is equal-weighted, which helps reduce reliance on a small number of very large companies and can provide broader exposure across dividend-growing stocks. It is typically considered by investors seeking a blend of income, quality, and lower-volatility equity exposure, though it may lag broader growth-oriented indexes when non-dividend-paying or faster-growing companies lead the market.
